To QRV with these homebrewed rigs is also one of the aims of this year.

New Year QSO Party by Yama, 7K1CPT #15028

Hello members! A Happy New Year.

This year, my 1st QRV was a field operation in *Hinohara-mura Nishitama-gun* TOKYO on January 2. *Hinohara-mura* village is west end of Tokyo. It is a mountain side about 1000m high from the sea level. *Okutama* excursion trails have some parking spaces. It is good for radio operation especially on V/UHF. Few years ago, I made friends with some ham radio operators and enjoyed QRV for New Year QSO party together there. But I was alone this year.

At 9AM, the gate was opened and I drove to *Sengen*-ridge parking. I built an HF Dipole, a 50MHz Hentenna and a 144MHz 5ele YAGI. First, I operated on 7MHz CW with my K2 5watts. I could have 26 QSOs including 12 QRP stations. In Japan, there are so many stations that operate only once a year for this New Year QSO party and exchange only RST and their names but I enjoyed talking with some stations with CW. They were JK1TCV/QRP, JH4QPI/QRP, JD1/JA1BVA/QRP, JE1RZR/QRP, JP6VCH/QRP and etc... I could make some ragchew QSOs with them.

In the afternoon, I changed the band to 144MHz and exchanged some "New Year Party Numbers" with CW mode. Then, I operated FM mode with my homebrew kit rig. It is 500mW output. I have never had QSOs on 2m at my home shack which was equipped with GP antenna for over 10 years because 2 meter band in Tokyo has been taken over by so many truck drivers and normal amateur radio stations were rarely heard. But on that day, I could have 19 QSOs with my tiny QRP rig. It was amazing!

At 17:30, I closed the station and left the place. I took a bath at *Kazumanoyu* hot spring. It was so refreshing and I felt just great! Hi. I hope to enjoy CW QSOs with FISTS members this year too. And I wish all of you will have a good year 2007. 73 and see you.
