My first-ever Japanese Morse codes QSO

Nao, JO3HPM #15008

I held up a promise in February issue that "I fixed April 1 as the first on-air day of my Japanese codes." Soon I started practice using a Morse training freeware and a MP3 player. My method was simple and only listening to the codes sounds which are listed in the order of Japanese syllabary again and again. It was like listening to the Buddhist sutra. I spent all commuting time during one month. Next, I made slow speed MP3 files of short Aesop's Fables by Japanese. At first I could not understand the contents. But one time, I could copy one word. Next one time, I could copy the other word. And at last, I could copy all word and understood the story. What a great joy it is! When start, single tone Dah-Dih sounds never have any meaning and these were just noise. But once I have learned the codes, the Dah-Dih sounds told stories. I surely felt a magic of Morse. I am happy to feel the magic twice. One was International Morse codes 18 years ago and the other is Japanese codes this time. I worked Atsu, JE1TRV using Japanese Morse codes on April 4 after all.

40-Meter Band Extended: In Japan, 40m band was allocated between 7.000MHz and 7.100MHz before 29 March 2009. After March 30, it is extended up to 7.200MHz. Some of Japanese brasspounders seem to be active between 7.100MHz and 7.130MHz though usual CW band is below 7.030MHz in Japan.

QSO PTY: I couldn't heard any participants and nobody replied to my CQ. It seemed that the propagations were so bad.

Learning Japanese Morse Code: After I heard Nao's news about his first QSO using Japanese Morse code, I began to learn Japanese Morse code. I have already learnt most of the code ;-)
